In her Rotary Minute, Linda mentioned how valuable the Rotary World Community Workshop at Defiance College is to all who participate. The annual three-day event focuses on a particular country and all aspects of its culture. While it is a great learning experience for the students, St. Marys Rotarians should also plan to attend next year and see what it is all about!

Program

President-elect Robbie Burke introduced our program about this year's World Community Workshop and asked high school Principal David Lewis to introduce the participants, all high school sophomores: Neil Perry, Brooke Hertenstein, Sarika Sivagnanam, Kevin Dammeyer. Focusing this year on the nation of Italy, students

attended Defiance College on May 12 - 14, 2011, to learn about Italian culture in a uniquely different way. Neil Perry decided to study Italian architecture, specifically Italian bridges. Brooke Hertenstein focused on the history of Italy, specifically Renaissance scientists. Sarika Sivagnanam was interested in Italian art, especially the glazing of tiles. Kevin Dammeyer (son of Karl) also focused on the history of Italy, the regime of Mussolini. All the students commented on how fun and interesting the event was and how they met interesting students their own age that may become lifelong friends.

Principal Lewis mentioned that these four sophomores chosen had the highest grade point averages of their class.



Rotarians asked about their current activities and school future aspirations: Neil mentioned football, Teens for Christ, and plans to become a medical doctor or join the air force. Brooke mentioned her church youth group, Relay for Life, marching band, and spoke of a desire to become a professional dancer. Sarika enjoys Art Club and is considering studying graphic design.
