Program

Dan Burke introduced Troy Anderson, the head of Homeland Security and Emergency Management for Auglaize County. In his spare time, Troy is also a 4-H director and his hobbies include beekeeping and remote-controlled airplanes.



Homeland Security (auglaizeco.org/ ema) handles every kind of potential disaster from chemical spills, weather-related emergencies and terrorist attacks. Troy personally conducts facility inspections and helps each agency write a security plan if they have not done so and also a follow-up continuity plan to mitigate the disaster event and plan for the future. He often visits hospitals and soon will be visiting nursing homes, which must plan to protect their clients in case of an event or evacuation. Auglaize Co. also has

devised a plan to which every village and township contributes. The federal government is hesitant to release disaster aid to a locality that does not have a written plan in place.

Mr. Anderson also helps with grant writing and serves as a pass-through agency to provide necessary emergency equipment/materials, e.g. warning sirens, and generators to be used in buildings designated as emergency shelters.

Another aspect of his multi-faceted responsibilities is documentation and cleanup of 40-60 spill responses per year. Even a one-day event, e.g. a recent crude oil spill, cost \$96,000. He tries to eliminate price gouging. Probably his worst spill issues are those of diesel fuel. A Hazmat team of 35 members has been available since the year 2000. Much hazardous waste does travel through Auglaize County. Real-life drills are also conducted at least once per year with police, fire chief, sheriff and other pertinent agencies. A Community Emergency Response Team is responsible for helping victims until Homeland Security can take over. An Emergency Operations Center, now housed in the St. Marys Council on Aging facility, has a goal of always being prepared, and rewriting guidelines as necessary.

Certainly stormy weather is a constant danger, like the 2005 ice storm and the flooding a few years later – each cost local businesses over one million dollars. Anderson's office also owns a mobile unit, allowing for quick deployment of a command structure in case of a weather event like a tornado.

Troy Anderson is also proud that he could help with the Silver Bridge collapse in West Virginia, directing the command structure in this event, for which he won a national award.

Truly his work is never done and he deserves our thanks!
