### Program

Dan Burke introduced our speaker, Sean Stroh from the Neil Armstrong Airport who gave us an update on the Airport.

Neil Armstrong Airport is a public use airport located eight miles southwest of the central business district of Wapakoneta, in Auglaize County. It is owned by the Auglaize County Airport Authority. It is included in the National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems for which categorize it as a general aviation facility.

The National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems (NPIAS) identifies nearly 3,400 existing and proposed airports that are significant to national air transportation and thus eligible to receive Federal grants under the Airport Improvement Program. It also includes estimates of the amount of money needed to fund infrastructure

development projects that will bring these airports up to current design standards and add capacity to congested airports. The FAA is required to provide Congress with a 5-year estimate of eligible development every 2 years.

The National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems contains all commercial service airports, all reliever airports, and selected general aviation airports.



Neil Armstrong Airport covers an area of 140 acres at an elevation of 913 feet above mean sea level. It has two runways of 5,500 by 100 feet with an asphalt surface, and 2,631 by 80 feet with a turf surface.<sup>[1]</sup>

The airport has an average of 30 aircraft operations per day: 94% general aviation, 6% air taxi, and approximately 1% military. There were 23 aircraft based at this airport: 70% single-engine, 17% jet, and 13% multi-engine.



The most recent economic impact study by the State of Ohio of what the airport contributes to the State. The

survey revealed that the Neil Armstrong Airport had a total positive impact of \$7.3 million to the local and State economy.

Total Airport Impact includes all employment, payroll, and economic activity related to the airport operations.

Sean reported that \$4.9 million has been invested in capital development at the airport since 1988. Future needs include improved and expanded utility service and a new storage and terminal facility.
