Program

PE Randy introduced John Bookmyer. John is the CEO of the Pain Management Group. John has an accounting background but now works with hospitals and health care groups to implement the current standard for pain management.



John thanked Kevin and the hospital for working with his group to add their pain management services to the hospital's care team. His group brings a new way to think about pain management. The old way was mostly narcotics. But the New Day Pain Management Center opened in Findlay and offered a different approach. Now there are 23 locations and will soon be 30. They provide an efficient and effective way to manage care of chronic pain.

Pain is a diverse problem and enters the health care system from many different portals. The new system will coordinate with primary care doctors to focus on acute and chronic pain. They commonly work with neck and back pain, arthritis, nerve pain and shingles patients.

Dr. Will Hogan will be the primary doctor here in St. Marys. He is a board certified anesthesiologist and a pain management fellow. Besides dispensing pills, they can make injections and cauterize nerve endings to provide pain relief.
