Kraig Noble introduced our Rotary speaker for January 18, 2017.



Our speaker, Dr. Steven Boehmfeldt is the director of Isaiah 61 a Christian counseling center located in The Gathering Place building on Spring Street. Dr. Boehmfeldt has had many careers, notably; serving as Ronald Reagan's chef. He came to St. Marys two years ago to serve out God's purpose for his life.

Dr. Boehmfeldt's culinary career achievements include:

- Degrees from the Culinary Institute in Hyde Park and Cornell University
- The Professional Chef's Association youngest member inducted at age 21
- Honors and awards for his "carvings" including a carving of The White House 1985, a hand-crafted structure using over 300 pounds of white chocolate.

Dr. Boehmfeldt was hired by Nancy Reagan because she wanted to achieve a new standard of exceptional food and service quality to dignitaries. He shared his experiences in the Reagan White House.



Despite his success in the food service industry, in 1991, Dr. Boehmfeldt experienced a series of pivotal events. He found his birth mother, got divorced and his adoptive mother dies. He turned these tragedies into a new vocation. He traded in his knives for a new recipe for success.
